**1.1 Face coverings**

Face covering will be mandatory as long as the Provincial and Local Health Region deem it mandatory. Please reference the DRESS CODE POLICY, 1.3 Masks, for full details of what is an acceptable mask/face covering. Should a bowler and/or parent/guardian be exempt from wearing a face covering, please notify the Tournament Director of the event ahead of time. An official medical doctors note must be provided for an exemption.

**1.2 Tournament Preparation**

While capacity limits are in effect, only one (1) parent/guardian will be permitted to attend an event with their Youth Bowler.

Upon arrival at the bowling centre, Bowlers and their parent/guardian will be screened for COVID-19 by the centre. Parents/Guardians, as well as Bowlers (depending on age and Health Region Guidelines) will be expected to show proof of full vaccination prior to entering the Bowling Centre.

Bowlers and their parent/guardian are expected to remain on the lane they have been assigned, with the exception of using the washroom, getting food or a beverage from the snack bar, or going outside for fresh air.

If a Bowler does not have their own personalized bowling balls, they are to use house bowling balls provided by the Bowling Centre. Bowlers with personalized bowling balls are encouraged to not share with other bowlers.

**1.3 Tournament Procedures (subject to change as restrictions loosen)**

Only three (3) Bowlers are permitted per lane. This is to accommodate the three (3) parent/guardians that will also be attending with the bowlers.

Bowlers are to bowl on one lane with a lane in between, to accommodate social distancing.

Tournament Directors may choose to change lanes between games from the odd to even lanes.  
Example, Game 1 bowled on lane 1, Game 2 bowled on lane 2, Game 3 bowled on lane 1. This is subject to the Tournament Director and Bowling Centre's discretion.
